

Trenton Neighborhood Initiative (TNI)





TNI - Four Pillars



LIVE

Housing, homeownership, and neighborhood improvement



WORK

Workforce training and support for small businesses



GROW

Family support services and trauma prevention



CONNECT

Affordable WIFI, training, and tech tools for residents



TNI is working to increase homeownership in Trenton, foster neighborhood revitalization, activate public spaces, and ensure residents have safe, healthy places to call home.



PROGRAMS

- Home Buyer Assistance Program
- Down payment Assistance \$20K
- Financial Counseling

GOALS

By December 2026, at least (NOTE: 2024 is year #3 of TNI):

- 50 homes will be purchased in the Trenton
 (as of 12/2023,15 home purchases; \$275,000 in financial assistance for first-time home purchasers)
- 100 Trenton residents will receive financial and/or homeownership counseling
- 25 homes in the neighborhood will be rehabbed
- 75 households in the neighborhood will receive healthy homes assessments
- 50 homes in the neighborhood will be made lead safe
- 4 properties will be developed/redeveloped

TNI is helping Trentonians gain access to the education and training needed for today's economy, preparing and creating employment pipelines for residents to work at Capital Health, and supporting local businesses and entrepreneurs.



PROGRAMS:

- Scholarships (up to \$5,000 per person) These scholarships are available to all students interested in healthcare professions, who enroll in MCCC.
- Pathways to Capital Health and Other Careers
- Business and Entrepreneurship Support
- THT is conducting a survey within the small business community (a collaborative effort).

GOALS:

By December 2026, at least:

- 150 Trenton residents will receive vocational training aligned with CH staffing needs
- 50 Trenton residents will receive scholarships for post-secondary education (as of 12/2023, 54 individuals were awarded \$107,792 in scholarships)
- 100 residents will be trained in business and entrepreneurship
- 20 neighborhood businesses will be strengthened through loans or grants

TNI offers individuals and families a broad range of services that meet both short- and long-term needs to help kids and their parents reach their goals.

By December 2026, at least:

• 250 families will receive family support services




VICTORY Program (Violence Intervention for the Community Through Outreach RecoverY)

Launched on November 4, 2020, this is a **H**ospital-Based **V**iolence **I**ntervention **P**rogram **(HVIP)** housed within the Institute for Urban Care **(IUC)** at Capital Health funded by the NJ Attorney General's Office.



OUR PROCESS



What You Need to Know

- Eligibility Must have a current or previous history of non-interpersonal community violence victimization (GSW, Assault, etc.).
- Participation in this program is voluntary!
- We accept both Trauma/ER referrals and community referrals
- We accept surviving immediate family members of deceased victims
- Each victim of gun violence, stabbing and/or serious physical assault will have access to a Trauma Outreach Specialist (TOS) as a first point of contact.

IMPORTANT TO REMEMBER - Our data suggests that trauma victims who are cared for through the Victory Program are **less likely** to experience future occurrences of the same trauma.

When a Person is Identified as Pregnant and Screens Positive for OPIOID USE...

Our Approach...

Using a community-based, collaborative model, this evidence-based program is an easy three-step process:

- 1. Identify
- 2. Connect
- 3. Treat

One call will initiate a cascade of care coordination, support, and treatment for pregnant and new mothers impacted by opioid use disorder.

Our focus is on the parent and baby's well-being and safety.
