WHAT IS IT?

The Trenton Neighborhood Initiative (TNI) is built on four core pillars (Live, Work, Grow, Connect) that focus on improving quality of life and economic opportunity for Trenton residents in specific areas of need. As part of TNI's Connect pillar, which is dedicated to promoting digital equity, we're offering computer literacy education sessions for eligible Trenton residents who have little or no experience with Internet technology. The program concludes with the distribution of free laptops for participants who complete all three sessions.

WHO IS IT FOR?

Residents of Trenton ages 18 and older who have little or no experience with Internet technology. Only "last dollar" or "GED" college students are eligible to participate. A government-issued ID with a Trenton address is required.

HOW DOES IT WORK?

Volunteers from Capital Health and Trenton Area Soup Kitchen provide training to help TNI-area residents successfully navigate the digital world. Upon completion of the three-day program, participants receive **FREE LAPTOPS** provided through a generous grant from Credit Union of New Jersey.
